2023 ANNUAL REPORT

Plumas Performing Arts had a productive year in terms of programming and accomplishments. 2023 saw the awarding of two college scholarships to local performing arts students, a complete revamping of our mini-grant program, participation in Round Up at the Register at the Feather River Co-op, and a comprehensive, county-wide summer music program offered in Portola, Greenville, Chester, and Quincy.

PPA continues to experience challenges with fundraising and a volunteer base. Recovery from the 2021 Dixie Fire is ongoing in Greenville and surrounding communities, and many families and organizations are still in survival mode both financially and with their capacity or availability to volunteer.

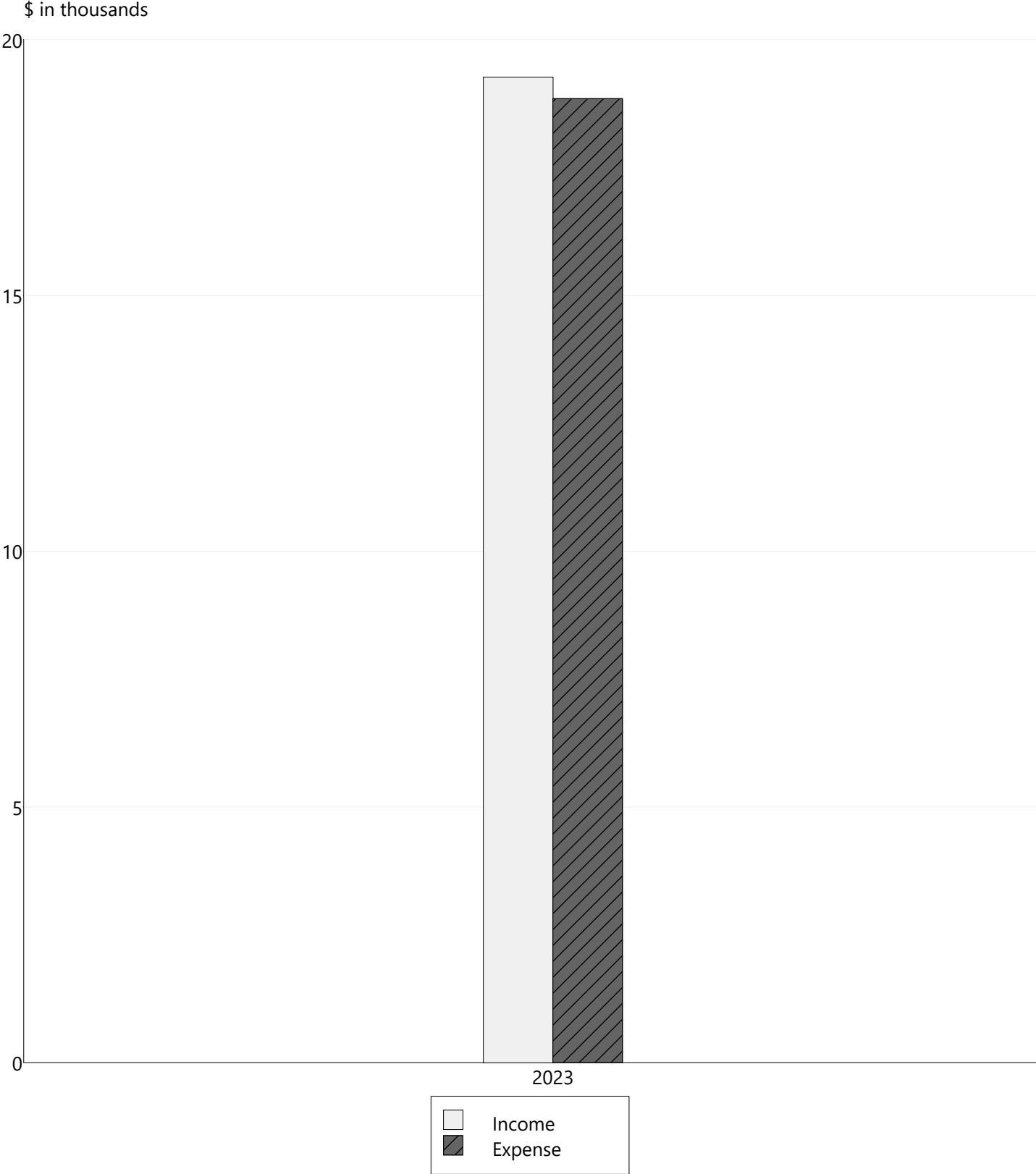
The Summer Music Program was our largest successful project. With generous donations from several local sponsors and community partners, PPA was able to offer music instruction by professional music educators in Chester, Greenville, Portola, and Quincy once a week through the month of July, a county-wide community band in Quincy, and a handbell choir in Chester. Additionally, we were able to purchase instruments for the programs including Boomwhackers for General Music instruction, metallophones, various types of drums and more. Over 100 students participated in the program.

The Outdoor Theater Project, under our nonprofit umbrella, held an Honorary Mayor fundraiser coinciding with Quincy's annual Groundhog Fever Festival.

Looking ahead to 2024 and beyond, Plumas Performing Arts hopes to expand outreach to build more volunteer capacity, investigate more fundraising opportunities via grant funding, and to fill our Portola and Chester directors-at-large positions to better represent the entire county. We have already begun planning a second summer music program with possible changes in formatting and have sent out surveys asking for input about last year's offerings. The Outdoor Theater Project has formed a community committee with the hope that multiple people can help move the project forward through the permitting and construction phases.
